ELIGIBILITY AND SCHEDULE OF CLASSES

Levels:

Rally handler/dog teams compete at one of six levels, from level 1 to level 6 Progression to the next level does not require either wins or places. Qualification is by achieving a score of at least 170 out of 200 on three occasions under three different judges.

Eligibility:

When entered for a competition, a dog must be entered in a standard class at the level for which it is eligible as defined below. The dog may also, if desired, be entered in one further standard class at the next level up, if scheduled, plus one additional special class, if scheduled.

In the following definitions, achieved a Level 1 title, achieved Level 2 title and so on means that the dog meets the requirements of having gained three qualifying scores of 170 or better, carried under three different judges, at the relevant level

Level 1: Open to dogs which have not achieved a Level 1 Title

Level 2: Open to all dogs which have achieved a Level 1 Title, except those that have achieved a Level 2 Title, Dogs eligible for and entered at Level 1 may also enter at this level.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

These Rules and Regulations are to be read in conjunction with The Kennel Club Rally Regulations S under which this show is licensed. It is the responsibility of everyone entering this show to make themselves familiar with the Kennel Club Rally Regulations available from the Kennel Club.

1. Judges as listed reserve judges will be appointed as necessary
2. Entry fee is £5.00 per dog, per class
3. ROSETTES to 6th place with Prize Cards. Qualifying certificates for all scores of 170 or better
4. Show opens 9.a.m. Judging commences 10 a.m.
5. First walk through is at 9.30 a.m. Competitors to report to Show Secretary's desk to book in and collect competitors ring no.
6. No bitch in season is allowed to compete
7. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the competition is forbidden
8. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries
9. Not for competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged four calendar months and over. Dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their full details recorded on the entry form
10. In the event that the show is cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances, the club will refund fees, less reasonably incurred expenses, on receipt of a stamped addressed envelope submitted within 1 month of the show date
11. Should a judge be unable to fulfil their appointment the organizer reserves the right to appoint alternative judge
12. It is the competitors responsibility to be available for their class and running order
13. Should circumstances so dictate the organizer, in consultation with the judges, may alter arrangements as necessary . Such changes will be reported to the Kennel Club
14. Only dogs of six calendar months of age and over are eligible for competition at Kennel Club licensed Shows in level 1 and 2
15. Competitors to report to Secretary's desk to collect competition ring numbers the book in at the Score Steward's Table.
16. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the precincts of the show.
17. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges.
17. After a dog has commenced competing in a class no substitution of handler is permitted in that class
18. For the duration of the show all dogs, including those in the exercise area, must be on a lead except when competing or practicing prior to competition.
19. Food or toys shall not be carried in the ring or given to a dog whilst under test.
20. The attention of competitors is drawn specifically to the Kennel Club Rally Competition Regulations 9, 17 and 19
21. A dog cannot be entered in the same class more than once
22. Once a dog has entered the ring to compete, no further practice may be carried out
23. A dog must at the time of entry for the competition, be registered as required by KC Rules and Regulations in the owner's name (or registration or transfer applied for) In the case of joint registered owners the full name of every registered owner must be given. Where an owner makes an entry on behalf of another, joint registered owners or where an agent enters on behalf of a single or joint registered owner, such person must have the authority and consent from the single or joint registered, A dog must, at the time of entry for the competition be owner(s) to sign the entry form on their behalf thereby binding them to all to KC Rules and Regulations. In the event of any dispute, evidence of such authority and consent will be required. A dog acquired subsequent to entry having been made at a completion may compete as the new owners property provided that an application for the transfer has been forwarded to the KC before the competition and the new owner has undertaken to abide by the Regulations and conditions of the original entry form (and in accordance with the conditions set out above).
24. Dogs will be disqualified if proved to have been handled by the scheduled judge's spouse or immediate family, or resident at the same address as the scheduled judge.
.Following discussion between the Chief Steward and the show management, a dog shall be removed from the show if it is (a) a bitch which is in season (b) suffering from any infectious or contagious disease, (c) interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent, (d) of such temperament or is so much out of control as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal, (e) likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing. The circumstances of such a removal shall be recorded in the competition incident book and submitted to the KC
25. Judges discretion prevails and Judges decisions are final
26. Welfare of Dogs: A competitor whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not knowingly put their dogs' health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. A breach of this Regulation may be referred to the General Committee for Disciplinary action under Kennel Club

Rules and Regulations.

27. No modifications may be made to the Schedule once published except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club which must be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press if possible.
28. Animals allowed at Show. No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the Show during its continuance, except any dog registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes, or by permission of the General Committee. However, at the discretion of the show society, a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the dog show, with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times
29. DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS
30. Your dog is vulnerable and AT RISK if left in a vehicle in high temperatures and even on days considered as slightly warm. Please take care of your dog. If your dog is found to be at risk forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused.
